And it came to pass, in their being there, the days were **fulfilled** for her bringing forth, (Luk 2:6)


And when eight days were **fulfilled** to circumcise the child, then was his name called Jesus, having been so called by the messenger before his being conceived in the womb. And when the days of their purification were **fulfilled**, according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem, to present to the Lord, (Luk 2:21-22)

And all in the synagogue were **filled** with wrath, hearing these things, (Luk 4:28)

and they beckoned to the partners, who are in the other boat, having come, to help them; and they came, and **filled** both the boats, so that they were sinking. (Luk 5:7)

and astonishment took all, and they were glorifying God, and were **filled** with fear, saying--`We saw strange things to-day.' (Luk 5:26)

and they were **filled** with madness, and were speaking with one another what they might do to Jesus. (Luk 6:11)



And Saul--who also is Paul--having been **filled** with the Holy Spirit, and having looked stedfastly on him, (Act 13:9)

and the whole city was **filled** with confusion, they rushed also with one accord into the theatre, having caught Gaius and Aristarchus, Macedonians, Paul's fellowtravellers. (Act 19:29)
